

Partpic Co-Founders Chosen for Forbes Magazine's "30 Under 30" List

Forbes Magazine announced that Partpic co-founders Jewel Burks and Jason Crain are on the 2016 Forbes 30 under 30 list. The annual list celebrates the brightest young entrepreneurs, breakout talents and change agents.

Partpic Inc. is an Atlanta-based startup designed to streamline the purchase of maintenance and repair parts using computer vision technology. Partpic has raised over \$1.5 million in seed funding to integrate its proprietary technology into mobile apps and websites of parts distributors and retailers.

The team is named a standout in the Manufacturing and Industry category, where they are praised for their proprietary technology that simplifies the industrial parts sales process through visual search.

"It is an honor to be recognized by Forbes Magazine," Burks, 26, said. "This motivates me to continue working even harder to meet our company's goals in the new year."

"It was never our goal to be recognized for our hard work, but our technology has a way of speaking for itself," said Crain, Partpic COO. "We believe that Partpic is on track to becoming an industry name in the very near future."

Partpic has won numerous national competitions, including the 2015 SXSW Accelerator and Steve Case's Rise of the Rest. In 2015, Partpic's emerging technology caught the attention of AOL co-founder and investor Steve Case, Reddit co-founder Alexis Ohanian, and President Obama. The company made history when they were invited to join President Obama at the first-ever White House Demo Day in August of that year.
